"So many spring birds about at the moment, mistletoe thrushes, blue tits, tree creepers and gold-crests. The carp came out of their winter stupor last week too as the warmer weather kicked in. I'm expecting Canada goslings as well as the usual ducklings and moorhen chicks this year.

The cormorant has been making regular sorties to the pond to feed on the smaller fish, which is always a fun sight. The seagulls are either pinching food meant for the ducks or fighting over sticks and leaves that they find on the pond. Always funny birds to watch and great to watch in the air."
